  - Motion to approve- all in favor
- Review of 2024 Bullying Policy- approved unanimously and determined that no changes were deemed necessary.

  - o Puckett: College 101 Family Night was successful
  - Oliver: Honor Roll Recognition, 38 scholars at LA
  - Hildreth: Scholars joining IEP meetings
  - o Ellis: Staff Committees have returned and all staff members are included
- Staffing Update (Boeddeker)
  - Currently looking for instructional aides and 1<sup>st</sup> grade Instructor
- Food Bank Update (Hull)
  - New partnership with ComEd for lightbulbs
  - o Most of our food (38%) is coming from Walmart
  - o 70 families will receive complete family meals for Thanksgiving (just for GRCS families)
- Financial Reports (Lane) Financials through Sept 2024
  - Cash on hand approx. two millions dollars
  - New fitness area at the UA and LA
  - Compliance Audit FY 24- No findings
  - Replaced Finance Manager- brought on Andrew Schmidt on contractual basis
  - Proposal to adjust board approval to purchases/contracts exceeding \$50,000
    - All purchases above \$50,000 need board approval
    - All purchases between \$25,000 and \$50,000 need to be discussed at the next board meeting
    - Vote- All in favor
- Academic Update- (Ellis, Hildreth)
  - NWEA MAP assessment was given in Fall



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- Math 29<sup>th</sup> percentile as a school
- ELA 38<sup>th</sup> percentile as a school
- Language Usage 36<sup>th</sup> percentile as a school
- SY Goals Reviewed
  - Increase scholars on grade level (both ELA/Math) by 20% on both the MAP and IAR assessments.
  - 80% of all scholars will demonstrate growth based on individual goals by spring 2024 (based on NWEA MAP)
  - 50% of all scholars in the bottom level of the IAR assessment will move up to partially meeting expectations.
