- New academic goals- 20% increase in reading and math
- Move 50% of scholars in the bottom level up
- MAP- 80% of scholars meet individual goals
- Attendance 23 Goals (Oliver and Cook)
 - o Growth of 4.7% of attendance for last year
 - Goal of 4.57% increase to 93% ADA
- Enrichment Update (Lane)
 - o Had a full summer of programming
 - o 24% of scholars participated in summer enrichment programming
 - o Goal to increase summer programming participation to 35% of scholars
- Enrollment Report (van Arneman)
 - Started the school year with 387 scholars (currently at 384)
 - o 64 people on the wait list
- Re-chartering (Lane)
 - We received a three year re-chartering agreement
