

GRCS Scholar College Scholarship

GRCS has created a Scholar College Scholarship Fund to support GRCS scholars attending four year institutions. The Fund is meant to provide a modest level of assistance. It is not designed to cover the entire tuition cost for any one scholar.

Deadline for submission: All submissions should be emailed to Mr. Lane at mlane@galapagoscharter.org by 9pm on **April 10, 2023**. All submissions should be typed. All applications must be submitted as a Word or PDF file. Applications submitted in the body of an email will not be considered.

Who can apply?: Any GRCS alum who is currently a rising Freshman, Sophomore or Junior at a four year institution. The scholar must have graduated from Galapagos Rockford Charter School and have attended GRCS for a minimum of two years. We do anticipate this to be a competitive process; so we suggest that scholars carefully prepare their responses.

Amount to be awarded: The amounts will be based upon the amount in the scholarship fund, this will vary based upon donations. We hope to be able to provide funding of between \$500 to \$5,000 per selected alumni applicant.
