

**SUBJECT**: Important Information about bringing medications to Space Camp!

## Hello!

Please note the following if bringing Medication to Space Camp:

1. All Medications (including prescription, over-the-counter, emergency inhalers, Epipens, and supplements of any kind) that are brought to Space Camp must have a valid prescription/pharmacy label. Please see below as an example:

Trainee Doe Junior Amoxicillin Oral Suspension 250mg/5ml Take 5ml orally three times per day/ signed Dr. Jane Smith, MD Lic#15926/AL NPI# 0987654321)

- 2. All Medication must be turned into Sick Bay at check-in and must be in the **original** packaging (no pill boxes or zip lock bags).
- 3. All medication/prescriptions must be in English.
- 4. We will not accept or administer any expired medications.
- 5. If you are bringing any Over the Counter Medications, please complete and upload the physician-signed "OTC Med Authorization" form (found on the last page of your child's health form) to your child's Space Camp profile.
- 6. If the medication needs to be divided, please precut it prior to bringing it to Space Camp.
- 7. **Medications NOT accepted:** Non-FDA approved medications, Medications containing THC, Medications deemed to be toxic or not safe for handling, Nut immunotherapy.
- 8. Sickbay does keep a selection of over-the-counter medications available for use that can be administered on an as-needed basis with parental consent. Please select which medications you give permission for when filling out the health form.

## 9. Please Note:

- a. Sickbay Nurses do not administer injections. All campers with injectable medication must be able to self-inject. Nurses will administer injectable Epinephrine and Glucagon emergency medications.
- b. An action plan is required for certain medical conditions. **Please send in the Asthma, Allergy, or Adrenal Insufficiency Action Plan** to our fax line (1-256-

- 721-7143) Attn Nurses or email to specialneeds@spacecamp.com at least 2 weeks prior to the start of camp.
- c. Any documentation (i.e. action plans, medication orders) submitted directly from the Health Care Provider (HCP) should include:
  - i. HCP full name and signature
  - ii. Medical License number and State (or international equivalent)
  - iii. NPI (national provider identifier) number
